complete with teacher resources that offer insightful lessons.

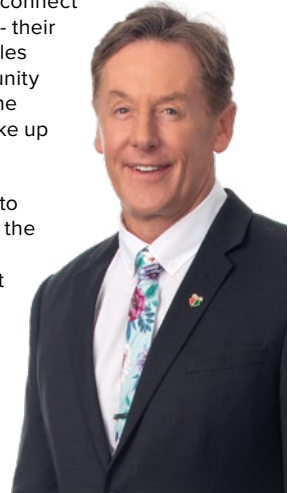

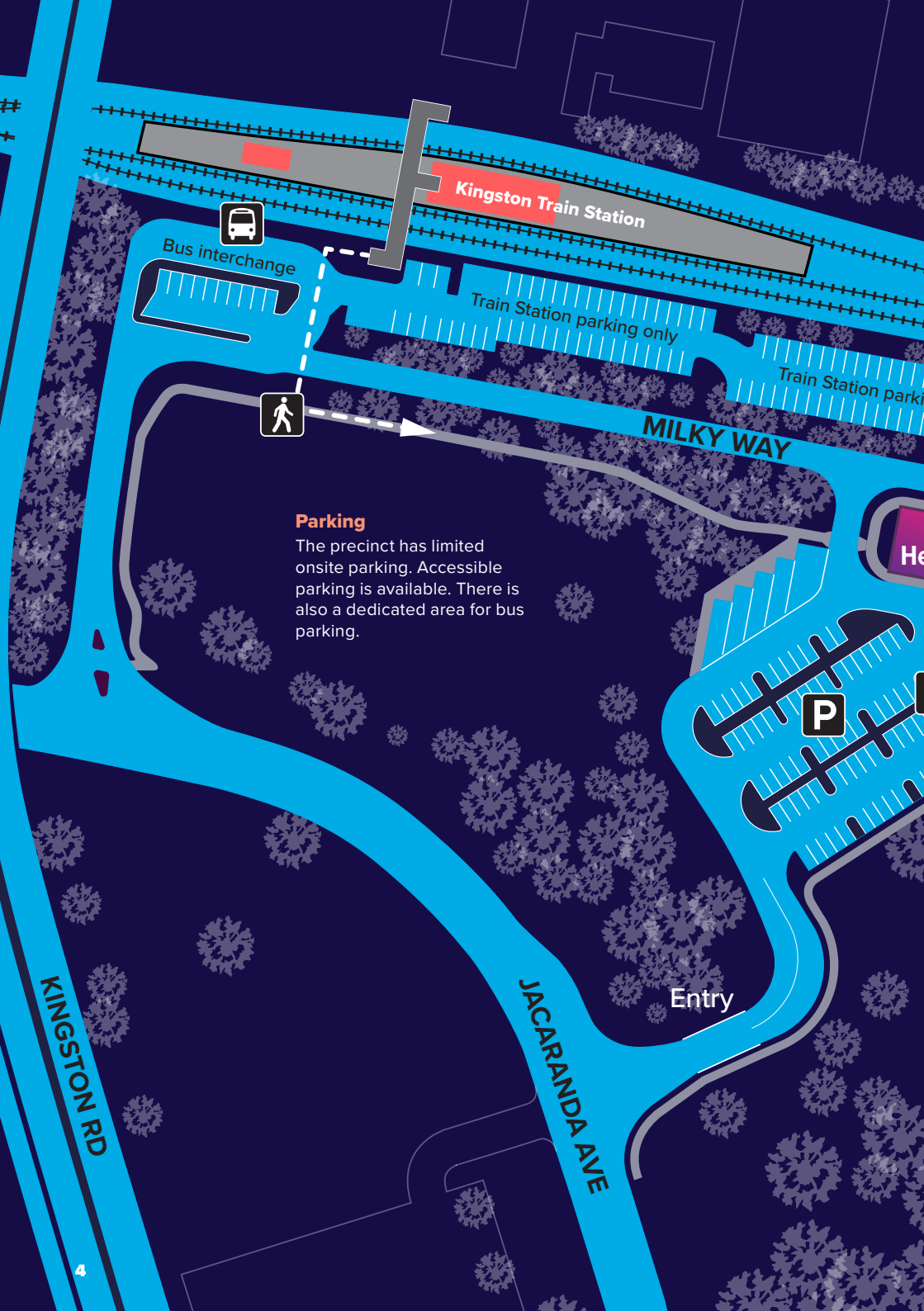

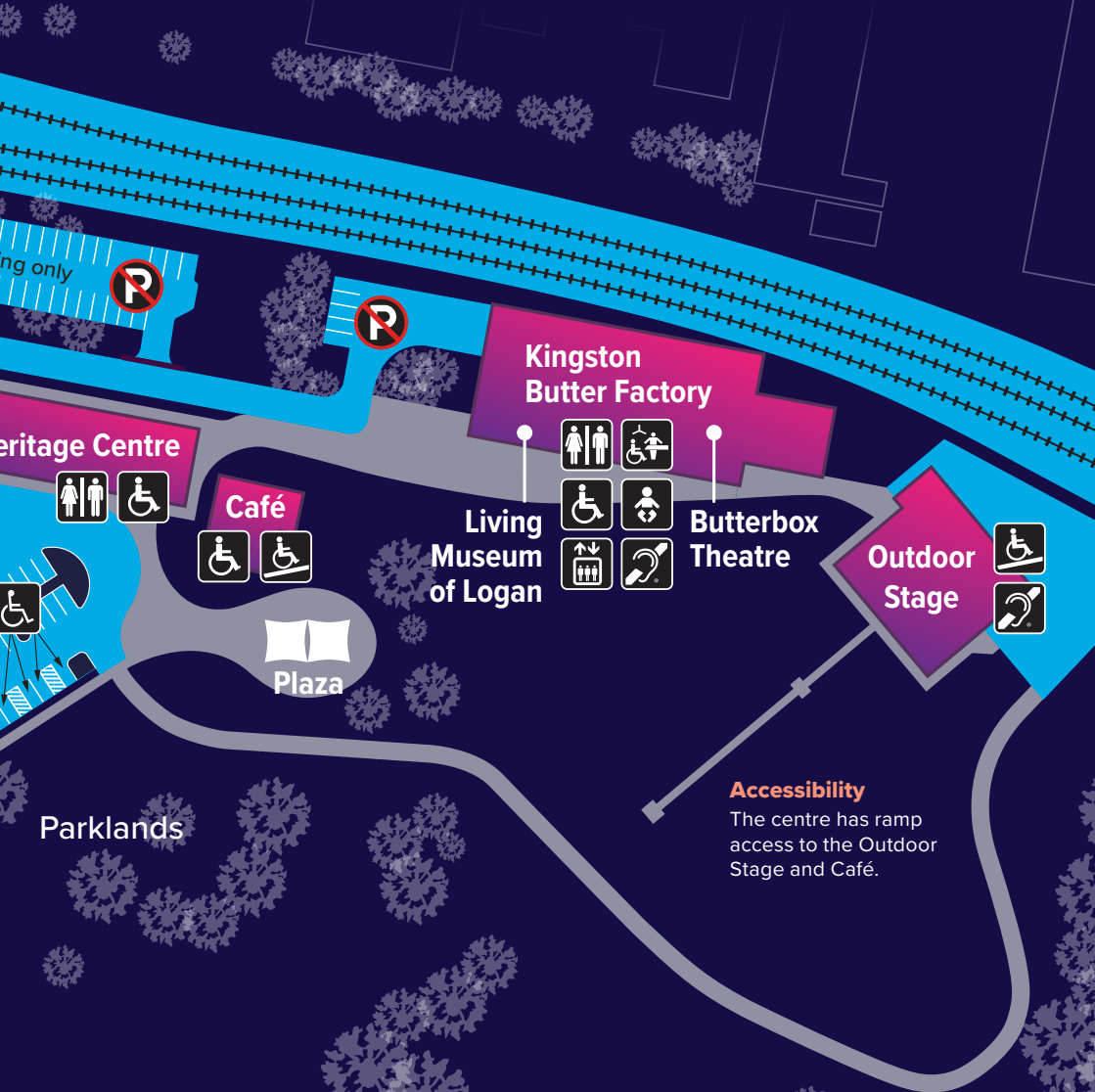

FIRST NATIONS SPACE

This space is co-curated with, by and for Logan's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. Visitors can learn about First Nations' languages and culture, and hear digital stories from Logan's Elders.

- **Our Aunties and Uncles** records the stories of 4 significant Elders in Logan in their own voices.
- **Our words our stories** are by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who live, work or perform in Logan City.
- **Wajin: The Guardian of Scrubby Creek** by Beverley and Reginald (Uncle Reg) Knox. Visitors can listen to this children's story narrated by Missy Knox, daughter of Uncle Reg Knox.

The Logan City Historical Museum was established more than 30 years ago with a charter to preserve Logan's past for the future. The museum's exhibits tell the story of the region's European settlement and development of the City of Logan from 1826 to the present day.

The museum was originally named the Kingston Butter Factory Museum. The displays consisted of butter factory-related items. It was renamed the Logan City Historical Museum in April 1995 when it was decided to collect and display other historical items.

The museum moved to temporary premises during the Kingston Butter Factory refurbishments. It now returns to the precinct in a purpose-built Heritage Centre.

Ongoing displays deliver a timeline of the founding of the Kingston Butter Factory and provide a glimpse into the history of Logan. Themes include farming, mining, timber, small industry, railway, schools and involvement in both world wars.

Several floods and fires as well as a tornado have occurred over the last century. This has also provided the museum with a rich tapestry of events from which to collect and exhibit.

The museum is owned and operated by the Logan City Historical Museum Society Inc. The society preserves items of historical significance to educate the public on the history of Logan since the early 1800s. These items reveal some of the influences that have created the community of Logan today.

PLAN YOUR VISIT

Getting there

Located at 270 Jacaranda Avenue, Kingston, QLD, the Kingston Butter Factory Cultural Precinct (KBF) is in the heart of Logan and easily accessible by pedestrians, public transport or vehicle.



By road the precinct is conveniently located between Brisbane and the Gold Coast, just 5 minutes off either the South East Freeway or the Logan Motorway.



By rail you can access the precinct via Beenleigh or Ferny Grove lines. Disembark at the Kingston Train Station then take a 200m stroll from the station to the venue.



TransLink bus routes stop within a short walk of the precinct. The 3 closest bus stops are Kingston Station (4 min. walk), Kingston Road at Gould Adams Park (9 min. walk) and Clare Road near Kingston Road (12 min. walk).



The precinct is easily accessible by bicycle, with a local cycleways network connecting KBF to key activity centres in the City of Logan.



PARKING

The precinct has limited onsite parking. Accessible parking is available. There is also a dedicated area for bus parking.

PROOF OF CONCESSION

Discounted tickets are available to fulltime secondary and tertiary students undertaking Austudy, Abstudy or Queensland TAFEs, universities and other approved educational institutions. Student cards must be shown upon entry.

Pensioners holding a current valid Pensioner Concession Card or Queensland Repatriation Health Gold Card issued by Centrelink or Department of Veteran's Affairs are eligible for concession. **(The 'Health Care Card' issued by Centrelink is not accepted.)** Seniors holding a Queensland Seniors Card are also eligible for concession. Valid concession cards must be presented upon entry.

Holders of a Queensland Seniors Business Discount Card are not entitled to concession rates.

Companion card

Kingston Butter Factory Cultural Precinct accepts Companion Cards for selected performances. The Companion Card must be presented at time of booking or the Companion Card ID provided.
