FACTORY STORIES:

Inspired by the concept of the living museum. *Factory stories* has been created by Logan artist Dr Nicola Hooper, this artwork focuses on Kingston Butter Factory's history and premise for bringing community together.


It includes a customised wallpaper designed and illustrated by Hooper, featuring graphics by First Nations Logan artist, Kyra Mancktelow.

The wallpaper recognises the aboriginal land that the factory has been built upon, for the purpose of being a meeting place for community. It acknowledges the railway which was the lifeblood of the distribution of the butter, the dairy farms who contributed to the production of the butter along with the pig farm which ran beside the butter factory.

The installation also includes a series of animated portraits that are framed and hung over the customised wallpaper.

The portaits replicate people, past and present who provide an insight into their connection with KBF. It celebrates the stories of those who worked in or utilised this building. KBF was an innovative factory that contributed to the growth of the dairy industry in Queensland. It remains a key part of community, economic and social life to the people of Logan. The importance of community resonates through 'Factory Stories' as it does throughout the entire 'Living Museum'.

Nicola Hooper is a Brisbane/ Logan based visual artist. She has grown up and continues to live and work on the lands of the Yuggera people in Logan.

Nicola has had a long career as a practicing artist with her works being exhibited nationally and internationally. She completed her doctorate of visual arts with a Griffith University Postgraduate Scholarship in 2019. Her studio practise explores concepts surrounding zoonoses and human/animal relations particularly in the narration of anecdotal news stories both visually and verbally through a fairy tale and historical rhyme context.

Dr Nicola Hooper's *ZOONOSES* exhibition presented by Logan Art Gallery, Logan City Council, in partnership with Museums & Galleries Qld is currently touring Australia, and includes 12 venues over the next 3 years. The project has been assisted by the Australian Government's Visions of Australia program, and is supported by the Qld Government through Arts Qld and is sponsored by Haymes Paint.

Other recent projects include the James the Rat King Experience for Curiocity Brisbane. The publishing by State Library of Qld of an illustrated children's book The Cow that Swam out to Sea. Nicola also participated in the Springwood Carpet Pathway Project along with a number of research projects, she has also won and been shortlisted for a number of prestigious art prizes.
